# I. OPENING ITEMS

The minutes, were seconded, and **approved** 4-0, with 1 abstention

E. Spotlight Awards-James Caldwell and John Phillips for going above and beyond in preparing the park for Labor Day, Darlene Stumpf for helping sort all the mail for Mosquito abatement ballots, and Deborah Kiel for helping out a neighbor in need.

# II. MANAGEMENT REPORTS

- A. President-Mark thanked all for effort in Labor Day events, and reminded all about redwood feather cleanup for fire safety
  - B. Vice President-Cyndy thanked all for their volunteerism
- C. Secretary-Heather reminded all of bulletin deadline on Sept. 26th, and to be kind to our neighbors, remembering that our actions impact others
- D. Treasurer-Pat thanked Carol Vautin, who donated a piano for the Social Hall, members are responding to the letters for submeters and thus far we have collected \$187,300, we are on hold for Bay Fed account moves voted on last meeting, due to signature cards, budget vs. actual shows water costs are down, we showed profit for August, but show a negative for year, due to cost of roof
- E. Director at large-Bill shared that we have lots of kids in park so slow down, and make sure any delivery persons you use are using correct entrances/exits, especially large vehicles

# III. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Recreation-Holly Swanson 577 Scottishrite thanked everyone for all Labor Day help and events, thanks to Ed Bradley for the trophies for Labor Day, and the dinner profit was about \$3500, which benefits the Safety Committee, there is a potluck tonight in the Social Hall, Oct. 5th is next meeting at 10AM, Book Club at noon, and Bunco from 3-5, then we will have pumpkin carving Oct. 25th, with potluck of finger foods Friday Oct 31st with Ramblers to play 6-8 and

DJ dance from 8-10, with a costume contest in the Social Hall, still need a volunteer for Nov. potluck on the 15th.

- B. Safety-no report
- C. Financial Oversite-Tami Grove 183 St. Bernard shared the committee is currently meeting twice a month, good on budget vs. actual, and are working on an inventory of assets,
- D. Water-Michael Bates 396A Cavern shared the proposed quote from Santa Cruz Plumbing to approve, and MeterNet contract for the meters themselves are ready for signature

Winston Chavoor 115 Keystone asked how things like broken shutoff valves in the Christy box, be dealt with? Answer-There might be an extra work change order and the park would then be responsible for the cost.

Mark Zevanove 274 Keystone asked for the total cost of both submeters plus the installation. The total expenditure will not exceed \$545,218, assuming there are no change orders. He then asked if we have asked other companies for meter reading/billing to help us reduce the cost. 15 companies have been contacted, with MeterNet being the most responsive and a 97% retention rate. Answer-Yes, we can ask them to help us lower the costs of installing the meters, and Mark will work with Michael to make the request of MeterNet. The \$9 per month fee includes maintenance of system, as well as billing.

Fred Dunn-Ruiz 382 Hiram asked about the timeline. Answer-It is about 6 months to a year.

Sharon Simas 615 St. Augustine shared she is a spokesperson for a group and a lawsuit will be filed on Wednesday against the park.

Winston Chavoor 115 Keystone asked about the water leak last week on Royal Arch. Answer-It was a minor leak, was caused by contractor, but all is now fine.

Discussion from the Board ensued.

Pat moved to accept the quote from MeterNet at a fixed cost of not to exceed \$95,877, it was seconded, and **approved** 5-0.

Mark moved to accept the quote from Santa Cruz Plumbing at a fixed cost of not to exceed \$449,341, it was seconded, and **approved** 5-0.

- E. Staking-Michael Bates 396A Cavern shared stakings are behind but we are now training several teams, and a queue may be ready for bulletin
- F. Building-Michael Bates 396A Cavern shared we are trying to simplify the building packet to include following the city requirements, and Pat will work with office to get the list of projects back on display on the porch, like in the past.
- G. Tree-Sharon Naraghi 228 Acacia shared they met on Sept. 9th, will be revising the tree request form, which will include pictures, they plan to meet with CalFire and County in Oct., will work on member outreach, restoring the tree book to the office, and a streamlined process for emergencies, the next meeting is Oct. 7th-see notes attached

Kristy Swor 246 Washington also shared we have an insect infecting our Box Elder and potentially the Sycamore trees-may want to get one tree company to come in and take all the trees down that are infected and chip the wood and leave it on site-tree committee will start mapping out where they are located-Kristy will start flagging trees throughout the park

An Ecological Restoration project will occur again on Oct. 12th-working on a Draft forestry plan for the park-Mark will create a separate folder for the Ecological Restoration information on the website-Kristy clarified the recent work done on Washington path did not take out any unauthorized redwood trees, it simply exposed previously cut trunks by removing the suckers

Winston Chavoor 115 Keystone shared they saw a tree across the river come down

Tami Grove 183 St. Bernard shared the disease happens very fast Bill suggested the committee look at the culvert that runs along Hwy 9, as it needs clearing-Michael Bates said we can work with CalTrans to clear it

Melissa Allred 194 St. Bernard shared that when the new highway by her place was installed, they addressed the piping.

H. Orientation-Denise Peterson 682 St. Paul shared there were 10 people last week, and needs the new ByLaws and R & P to be posted on website, the next meeting is Oct. 12th, Board would like a Zoom recording, so Winston Chavoor will record it

### IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- A. Sign for Keystone-Heather shared she found a sign on Amazon to purchase for the one way section near the Powder House-\$23.99 plus tax to purchase it. Bill moved to approve the purchase of the sign from Amazon, it was seconded, and **approved** 5-0
- B. Cones & Chains-Heather presented proposed Amendment #1 to be placed in R & P as 1.10 as follows:
  - "On a members allotment, cones are only acceptable to alert drivers to imminent danger caused by a temporary problem, ie, a fallen tree, or when a building packet indicates the need for such. Chains are never acceptable."
  - Heather moved it, it was seconded, and **approved unanimously.** Therefore, it is now in effect, until ratification at the next election in June 2026.
  - Mark asked how we address those with significant concerns. Pat shared there are alternatives, such as logs, planter boxes, etc. things that are more appealing to place in those spaces.
- C. SC County Light pollution-Pat sent us county regs.-board can ask for members to shield lights, etc.-Board will read and bring it back next month-let office know if you have PG & E pole lights that are on 24 hours with identifying the pole number
- D. Reclamation of allotments per county-Pat says the county says it is possible to have one allotment with a garage on an empty allotment, there would be a variance cost of \$2500 as a one time cost
  - Michael Bates 396A Cavern shared we can only do what the county will allow. Fred Dunn-Ruiz 382 Hiram asked how is this different for a tent/carport? Answer-There would be no services at the empty allotment.

- B. Gate Check-James Caldwell shared it is next week and will need two light towers-Mark will get them

The Tree Committee met on September 9, 2025. After making corrections to the previous minutes-particularly clarifying concerns about the need for tree trimming in the park-the minutes were unanimously approved. During officer elections, Sharon Simas was appointed secretary. The committee agreed to revise the tree request forms to make them clearer, require photos, and specify that one form must be submitted per tree. Several new requests were reviewed: routine trimming requests were approved, while incomplete or unclear submissions were returned for clarification. A concern raised by Mr. Felice regarding a redwood tree was referred to the Board for further consideration. The committee also discussed the overlapping responsibilities of Cal Fire and the County, with plans to meet both agencies in October. Additional topics included improving member outreach, restoring the Tree Book to the office, and creating a streamlined process for emergency cases. A park member also raised the need for a formal procedure and Board oversight regarding ecological restoration signage and how such signs are posted in the park. Action items included drafting a revised request form, restoring the Tree Book, scheduling agency meetings, and ensuring Google Drive access for members. The meeting adjourned at 8:43 PM, with the next meeting scheduled for October 7, 2025.

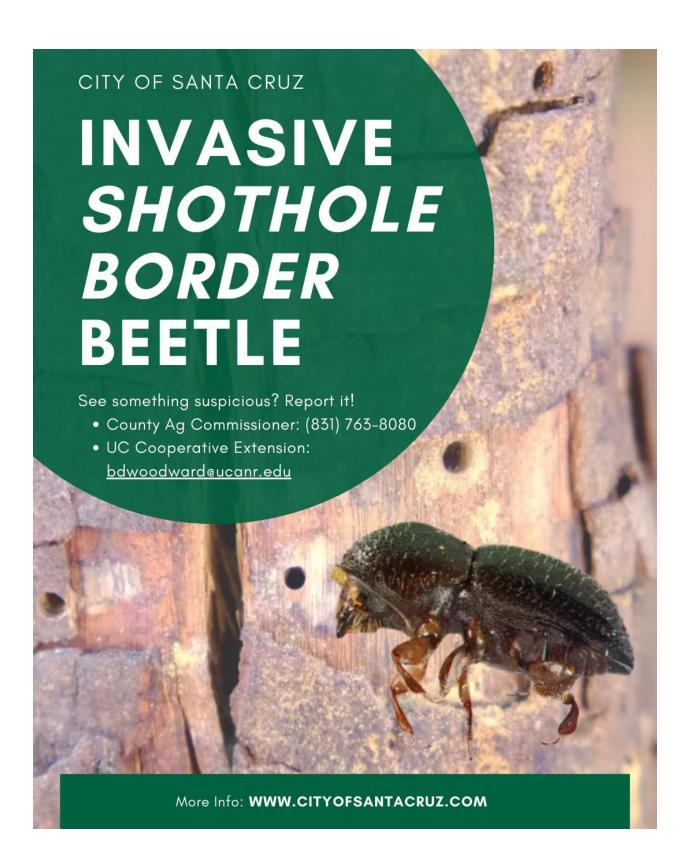

# Invasive Beetle Detected in Santa Cruz Public Asked to Help Spot and Prevent Spread

Santa Cruz, CA — The Santa Cruz County Department of Agriculture, in partnership with the University of California Cooperative Extension, has confirmed the presence of the invasive shothole borer beetle in trees located in the Tannery area of the City of Santa Cruz. Arborists identified two affected trees, prompting local agencies to call on the public's help in early detection and prevention of further spread.

Invasive shothole borers (ISHB) are tiny beetles that can seriously damage or kill many types of host trees. In Paradise Park, just upriver from the Tannery, one heavily infested tree has been found with hundreds of entry holes—clear evidence that more beetles are present and spreading. Local officials want residents to be aware and vigilant in spotting early signs.

# What to Look For:

- Small, perfectly round entry holes (about the size of a ballpoint pen tip)
- Wet staining, gumming, frass (boring dust), or sugary buildup around holes

# How to Help:

• Take the ISHB Detection Assessment to check if your tree shows symptoms

By staying alert and reporting signs early, residents can play a vital role in protecting local trees and preventing further spread of this destructive pest.
